# Iran cooperating but doubts remain: IAEA

VIENNA - The UN nuclear watchdog said yesterday Iran was being more transparent about its nuclear programme but doubts remained about whether it was entirely for peaceful purposes and not to make atomic bombs.

The International Atomic Energy Agency's report high-lighted Iran's lack of credible answers to intelligence about explosives and missile design work relevant to making atomic bombs, calling it "a serious concern"

"In the last four months, in particular, we have made quite good progress in clarifying the outstanding issues," IAEA Director Mohammed ElBaradei said in a statement accompanying the report assembled by senior IAEA inspectors.
"On that score, Iran, in the

last few months, has provided us with visits to many places that enable us to have a clearer picture of Iran's current programme," ElBaradei said. "However, that is not in

my view sufficient."

Iranian chief nuclear negotiator Saeed Jalili said the IAEA report "is another document which proves the Iranian nation was right about the nature" of its nuclear pro-

#### India sets wages for housemaids working abroad

NEW DELHI — India has begun rolling out mandatory minimum wage requirements for housemaids working in the Gulf and parts of Africa and southeast Asia, a minister

said yesterday.

"They are the most exploited lot," Minister of Overseas Indian Affairs Vayalar Ravi said, citing frequent complaints of harassment, overwork and low wages from female domestic workers

"They are not covered by the labour laws of those coun-

Indian embassies in 18 countries have been told to prescribe minimum monthly wages for maids in the range of \$300-350 in consultation with the local governments. the minister said.
"Otherwise we will not

give them clearance to go," said Ravi, adding that he expected Indian embassies in the countries concerned to issue wage guidelines by the beginning of March. — AFP

# Will travellers to Europe face fingerprinting?

MUSCAT - Will all foreign travellers entering and leaving Europe face finger-

printing? Times of Oman spoke to a cross-section of people in Oman and abroad and explored the European Commission's (EC) last week proposal that all foreign travellers entering and leaving Europe, including US citizens, should be fin-

gerprinted.

Does this actually make the world a safer place? The Times' enquiry evoked mixed, but thought-provoking reactions

Many of the 27 EU countries such as Belgium have very strong privacy laws that specifically limit access to database. Reaction to the EU announcement in the Gulf has been slow as the timing and logistics of the plan remain uncertain.

"Thousands of Arab nationals, especially businessmen and executives, including the AGCC citizens, visit Europe on a daily basis. If approved by the European parliament, this proposal, according to Arab travellers, would allow friendly governments around the world to share information on tens of millions of people," Ali Hassan Al Balushi, a regular business traveller, opined

Will this database pose the risk of abuse? This, according to Al Balushi, has to be debated, globally. Unauthorised access to info of this nature, he said, could reveal executive travel patterns. It's another way to know what you're doing, and where you are going.

ANKARA — Turkish ground troops crossed into northern Iraq in their hunt for Kurdish PKK rebels, the military said yesterday, describing the star of a campaign one report said could last 15 days

The White House said the United States had been informed in advance of Turkey's offensive and called on Ankara to limit the operation to "precise targeting" of the PKK rebels who have been using northern Iraq as a base to stage attacks in Turkey.



# Sadr extends ceasefire by six months

KUFA (Iraq) — Moqtada Al Sadr ordered his Mahdi Army militia to prolong its ceasefire for a further six months yes terday, to the evident relief of the United States

The decision to keep the force's black-clad fighters off the streets was welcomed by the US military, who once saw the Mahdi Army as the greatest threat to the future of Iraq but now hope Sadr can be a stabilising influence.

In Washington, the White House called the renewal a "positive development."

Shiite imams in mosques across south and central Iraq opened sealed letters from their populist movement's leader and read his statement to supporters after Muslim weekly prayers six months after the truce was first truce was first

"I prolong the freeze in the activities of the Mahdi Army until the 15th day of the month of Shabaan," Sadr said, using the Islamic calendar to indicate that the ceasefire will continue at least until August

"I cannot support the crimes of criminals, nor the sins of sinners, and I creat-ed this army on the principles of the tradition of the Prophet (PBUH)," according to the letter read by the imam at Sadr's mosque in Kufa, Assaad Al Nasiri.

The White House vesterday welcomed Sadr's call as a "positive development.

"We welcome any move that forswears violence and encourages peaceful partici-pation," said White House spokesman Scott Stanzel.

announcement today serves to further isolate the groups that are engaging in violence and to the extent that it helps enhance our intelligence to root out those groups, it's a positive development," he said. Sadr did not appear publicly at Friday prayers, and it is not clear where he is now based. Some reports have sug-gested that he has crossed the border into Iraq's neighbour Iran, but his group would not

The decision to continue the ceasefire was not univer-sally welcomed by Sadr's supporters, some of whom had been hoping for a return to their former campaign of violence against American

and Iraqi security forces.
"I know I must obey this decision, but I don't support it because it harms us. We have been exposed to revenge attacks and political score-settling," said Mohammed Ouz, a 35-year-old Mahdi Army militiaman in Karbala.

But other fighters said a truce would allow time for Sadr to further purge his movement of criminal elements, and for Prime Minister Nuri Al Maliki's government to address Shiite demands.

"Sevved Mogtada's decision is right and aims to unite our movement and stop the shedding of Muslim blood,' said Nazar Jabbar, a 25-year-old Mahdi Army guard at the Kufa mosque. Sadr ordered a six-month freeze in attacks on rival armed groups and US forces late last August after allegations that his fighters had been involved in bloody clashes with security forces in

the shrine city of Karbala.

The decision came at the same time many Sunni groups in western Iraq decided to join forces with the US military to fight Al Qaeda and amid a "surge" in American troop numbers. These three developments combined have led to steep decline in fighting between rival factions southern and central Iraq, but Iraqi leaders have always known that the relative peace

was fragile. Sadr's supporters claim that rival Shiite groups within the government security forces have used the truce as leading figures in their move

Sadr forces have in particsadr forces have in particular clashed with another powerful Shiite group, the Supreme Iraqi Islamic Council (SIIC) of Abdel Aziz Al Hakim, in southern cities such as Diwaniyah and Amara. In the southern port city of Basra, senior Sadr supporter Sheikh Ali Al Saidi velcomed announcement.

"We see this freeze as a chance for the government to review its policies," he said. "At any moment we can expect the Seyyed (Sadr) to lift the freeze if it is neces-"This extension of his

August 2007 pledge of honour to halt attacks is an importan commitment that can broadly contribute to further improve ments in security for all Iraqi citizens," the statement said.

"We also welcome an

opportunity to participate in dialogue with the Sadr Trend and all groups who seek to bring about reconciliation in building the new Iraq," it White House spokesman

Australians generally believe their country to be largely corruption free and it ranks well on the international index prepared by Transparency International.

Amid the public ICAC hearings, state Premier Morris Iemma promised to sack a senior minister if he was found to have improperly given a job to a Wollongong city councillor linked to the Four other state ministers

have also been indirectly linked by the ICAC to central figures in the furore. "Anyone found to have

done the wrong thing will be out, no matter who they are, Iemma said. — Reuters

The protest came after sev-al hundred Serbians opposed to Kosovo's independence broke into and set embassy in Belgrade.

The embassy was unstaffed at the time of the attack, but an unidentified person died in the incident. McCormack said all US staff were safe.

When contacted, Susan Gurley, executive director of the US-based Association of Corporate Travel Executives (ACTE), said: "ACTE, with membership in 82 countries, including the Middle East, sees the potential for abuse in a growing trend by governments to rely on higher levels pected terrorists or criminals hroughout the global transportation network

While it is the obligation and duty of any gover to safeguard the security of its citizens, travel privacy and identity security must be part of any security equation, Susan told Times of Oman

"Our concerns were mirrored by privacy advocates in the EU and in the US who are opposed to the automatic sharing of biometric data between governments, and security specialists who oppose storing so much sensitive information in one place.

"For example, travellers from Oman, or anywhere throughout the Middle East and the Gulf states travelling to Europe might suddenly dis-cover that their fingerprints and/or other data were being shared with the US govern ment and or other governments - even if they had no plans of visiting the US and or another non-EU country," Susan said.

The association's position, she said, was prompted by an announcement from the EU last week, in which that governing body on Brussels has proposed the fingerprinting of all non-Europeans entering

the 27 countries of the region ACTE, she said, was con-cerned that the EU might share this data with other gov-ernments, which would impact the privacy or identities of millions of international travellers. The law also

proposes that the information

be stored for several years. She, however, said it was not clear at this point how the information would be destroyed and whether people would have access to information if and with whom the fingerprinting data was shared. What are the auditing protocols that are being discussed? It's not clear.

"ACTE believes that there may be no need to create or support this kind of thirdparty data sharing unless there are clear protocols in place to ensure the safety of the data," she added.

The fingerprinting requirement for the EU is still in the embryonic stages, as the governments of 27 coun tries now have to vote on it Furthermore, it should be noted that civil rights groups and European privacy groups have already voiced strong opposition to this propos

'It's going to be challeng ing to recognise the privacy ramifications of the law, especially for the average traveller/business executive," says a Singapore-based Gulf

"It's a new trend, especially, after September 11. The outcome can be positive and negative. But all are going to be tagged. I think the US and EU, if necessary, can follow everything we do. They know where we are," says young Arab entrepreneur Kalid

#### **Putin to host leaders** of six ex-Soviet states

MOSCOW - Russian President Vladimir Putin was to host leaders of a group of ex-Soviet states yesterday, the Kremlin said, with Kosovo expected to figure high on the agenda. The meeting of the Commonwealth of Independent States, a group of 12 ex-Soviet nations, was officially due to discuss economic cooperation, a Kremlin statement said. It was also to feature a presentation by Putin's favoured successor at a March 2 presidential poll, Dmitry Medvedev. But Russian newspapers predicted that Kosovo's declaration of independence from Serbia would loom large. Russia, a permanent member of the UN Security Council, vehemently opposed Kosovo's independence declaration, reflecting Moscow's close ties with the leadership in Belgrade Yesterday Russia's Foreign Ministry said it regretted attacks that have taken place on Western embassies in Belgrade but said Kosovo's backers were partly to blame. At yesterday's meeting Moscow will try "to persuade colleagues to stand united against the region of Kosovo," the *Kommersant* broadsheet quoted an unnamed Kremlin official as saying. Another newspaper, Nezavisimaya Gazeta, said that the issue of two separatist territories in the ex-Soviet state of orgia — Abkhazia and South Ossetia While Russia has given those territories de facto backing it is unlikely to move to recognise them formerly, especially amid recent signs of an improvement in relations with Georgia, analysts say. But Nezavisimaya Gazeta quoted an unnamed Russian Foreign Ministry official as saying that other ex-Soviet states, such as Belarus and Kyrgyzstan, could recognise Abkhazia and South Ossetia

#### Japanese who was shot in the eye by Israeli troops may lose sight

BILIN - A Japanese translator who was shot in the eye last month during a demonstration against Israel's construction of a West Bank separation barrier said vesterday he may permanently lose his sight. Kaoru Kishida, 43, watching the demonstration on January 25 when he was struck by three rubber bullets, with one hitting him in the eye. "I was operated on several days ago and I have still not recovered the sight in my left eye," Kishida said. "I should be operated on again in two or three months, and it will only be after that surgery that a definitive diagnosis will be made." Kishida was speaking just days before Israeli Prime Minister Ehud Olmert is due to travel to Japan, amid press speculation that the incident might sour his visit. Army radio said yesterday that the army had denied firing any rubber bullets on that day, but only smoke grenades. # **British troops accused of** executions, torture in Iraq

**LONDON** — Lawyers for five Iraqis have accused British soldiers of mass executions and torture and called for a police investigation into an 'atrocious episode' in British army history. Phil Shiner and Martyn

Day, who have brought several cases against the British military for its actions in Iraq. produced statements yesterday from five men who say they were detained by British forces after a battle in southern Iraq in May 2004.

The men, who were blind-folded and bound, said their captors repeatedly beat and abused them, including forc-ing them to strip naked. While detained, they said they heard execution of up to 20 other

"On the basis of the evidence currently available, we are of the view that our British were responsible for the torture and deaths of up to 20 Iraqis — may well be true," Day told a news conference. "Whether or not there is enough evidence to prose-cute individual soldiers, it will only be by an open public inquiry that this question will be answered." The military has already conducted its own investigation into the events surrounding the intense, twohour battle between British troops and Iraqi activists, in

Shiner and Day say, on the basis of the witness statements and other evidence that 29 people were detained, of whom 20 were killed in detention and nine were later freed. A second investigation, also by Britain's military police, was opened last December after the families

which it says 28 Iraqi fighters were killed, and concluded there was no evidence of

criminal wrongdoing.

for a judicial review. It is no known when that investiga-tion will be concluded.

As well as the witness statements, Shiner and Day produced photos, video footage and death certificates signed by Iraqi doctors that they said together painted a picture of violent, deadly abuse perpetrated by British troops. They said there was evidence that two detainees had their eyes gouged out, one had his genitals cut off, several were strangled or mutilated, some were shot in the back of the head and others had body parts systematically broken.

"What went on whilst UK forces had the custody of Iraqi civilians is a disgrace, a stair on our nation, and a terrible stain on the reputation of all the good soldiers who have operated in Iraq," Shiner said.

#### Iran plans higher fuel prices but sees inflation

TEHRAN - Iran has 'no choice' but to implement a plan to offer drivers extra gasoline at a higher price out-side a subsidised rationing system even though it will increase inflation, a minister said yesterday.

A government committee has proposed making fuel available at up to seven times the current subsidised price available under a rationing scheme in place since June. The government has previously opposed the move because of the inflationary

largest oil producer but lacks refining capacity and imports large amounts of gasoline, which it then sells at the heavily subsidised price of 1,000 rials, roughly 11 US cents, a

Under the proposal, drivers would still be able to buy 120 litres a month at the subbuy extra fuel at between 5,000 and 7,000 rials (55-77 US cents).

"Naturally, a rise in gasoline prices will raise inflation but in regard to the necessity of the issue, some products should be offered to people freely (outside rationing) and unsubsidised." Minister Davoud Danesh Jafari said.

"Many of our people, if they are in need of fuel, and they have no access to it, they are willing to get it at a high-er price from others," he told Mehr News Agency, adding fuel was "very much more valuable" to people than 1,000 rials a litre.

Some drivers, who complain the rationing scheme does not give them enough fuel, already turn to a higher priced black market to buy extra gasoline.

#### **US** had ulterior motives in shooting down spy satellite?

YES, the Pentagon can obliterate a broken satellite tumbling at the edge of space. The question is, why bother? That is the reaction of some experts to the successful destruction on February 20 of a dead US spy satellite 153 miles over the Pacific Ocean. The official explanation — that the US wanted to prevent the toxic contents of the spacecraft's fuel tank from hitting the ground — seems a bit thin, according to James Lewis, director of the technology and public policy programme at the Centre for Strategic and International Studies. Thus critics from around the world have speculated about ulterior motives, ranging from a desire to test US ballistic missile defences to poking China in the eye.

Lewis says he thinks the Defence Department crunched the

numbers and found there was a chance the satellite might come down somewhere embarrassing, or dangerous, like the landmass of a foreign country. He thinks it was not the fuel tank's toxic hydrazine fuel, but a more general desire to prevent any impact, that led to the decision to shoot it down. "It was a surfeit of caution," says Lewis. A three-stage Navy SM-3 missile hit the satellite 153 miles up, just northwest of Hawaii, said military officials at a February 21 news conference. The missile's kill vehicle con tained no explosives and had to manoeuvre into the path of the satellite and collide with it, destroying it with kinetic force. The spacecraft — described as being about the size of a school bus, and weighing about 5,000 pounds — exploded spectacularly.

That fireball likely indicates that the frozen hydrazine fuel was destroyed, said military officials, but they won't know for sure until February 23 or 24. "Our objective was to intercept the satellite, reduce the mass that might survive re-entry, [and] vector that mass into unpopulated areas, ideally the ocean," said General James Cartwright, vice-chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff.

The military has long described the difficulty of hitting an object in space with a missile as being akin to striking a bullet with another bullet. With the 25th anniversary of president Ronald another buffer. With the 25th admixersary of president Rohador Reagan's original speech calling for a Strategic Defence Initiative coming up on March 23, the US has now fully demonstrated such a capability. "Yes, this was uncharted territory," said General Cartwright. "The technical degree of difficulty was significant here. You can imagine that at the point of intercept there were a few cheers that went up." Last year, China used a newly developed anti-satellite missile to destroy a weather satellite orbiting 528 miles above the earth. The unannounced move surprised the world and caused the US to react with anger and concern. The US spy satellite destruction was different from the Chinese move for two reasons, according to US officials. It was announced in

The Chinese move was not. It also took place at a low orbit, meaning the resultant cloud of debris for the most part will fall into the atmosphere and burn up. The Chinese anti-satellite missile left a cloud of debris in a higher orbit, endangering other spacecraft. But both the Chinese and the Russians complained about the US move, saying it risked accelerating an arms race in space and showed the hypocrisy of America's criticism of China. "China is continuously following closely the possible harm caused by the US action to outer-space security and relevant countries," said Chinese Foreign Ministry spokesman Liu Jianchao at a news conference in Beijing. Some critics say there's now a danger that the US move will provide other nations an excuse to move forward with their own programmes. Given that it has the most satellites of any nation, and its military depends more heavily on space assets than does any other, the US should be taking the lead in pressing for an international ban on weapons in space, said Laura Grego, an astrophysicist with the Union of Concerned Scientists, in an analysis of the impact of the satellite's destruction

arance companies that have guaranteed against defaults.
The magnitude of the economic crisis is underlined by the fact that the drastic remedial policy measures undertaken so far have apparently had only a limited impact. For instance, the Federal Reserve Bank reduced its benchmark interest rate five times since September bringing it down to 3 per cent. The Fed has also pumped in enormous sums of money to shore up liquidity. Yet even the promise of lower borrowing costs has failed to reverse the negative sentiment in stock markets in the US and practically everywhere else. Recently the Congress approved a large fiscal stimulus package aggregating \$168 billion. Besides providing for accelerated write-offs by certain businesses, the package would provide many categories of income earners a cash rebate beginning May. It might be too early to assess its impact but initial reactions suggest that even this package may not be able to revive consumer sentiment or alleviate the concerns over the economy. It seems that only by mending the parts of the financial sector that have given way will the policy makers be able to get a handle on the crisis. — *The Hindu*

# Technological cooperation

IN early February, the United States National Academy of Engineering released a report on "Grand Challenges for Engineering in the 21st Century." The goal is to focus attention on the potential of technology to help the world address poverty and environmental threats. The list includes potential breakthroughs such as low-cost solar power, safe disposal of CO2 from power plants, nuclear fusion, new educational technologies, and the control of environmental side effects from nitrogen fertilisrs. The report, like the Gates Foundation's similar list of 'Grand Challenges" in global health, highlights a new globpriority: Promoting ced technologies for sustainable development.

We are used to thinking about global cooperation in fields such as monetary policy, disease control, or nuclear weapons proliferation. We are less accustomed to thinking of global cooperation to promote new technologies, such as clean energy, a malaria vaccine, or drought-resistant crops to help poor African farmers. By and large, we regard new technologies as something to be developed by businesses for the marketplace, not as opportunities for global problem solving.

Yet, given the enormous

global pressures that we face

including vastly unequal incomes and massive enviental damage, we must find new technological solutions to our problems. There is no way, for example, to continue expanding the global use of energy safely unless we drastically alter how we produce electricity, power automobiles, and heat and cool our buildings. Current reliance on coal, natural gas, and petroleum, without regard for CO2 emissions, is now too dangerous, because it is leading to cli-mate changes that will spread diseases, destroy crops, produce more droughts and floods, and perhaps matically raise sea levels, inundating coastal thereby

And we will have to engage major companies in a new way, giving them ample incentives and market rewards for success, without allowing them to hold a monopoly on successful tech-nologies that should be wide-

ly adopted I believe that this new kind of global public-private part-nership on technology devel-opment will be a major objective of international policy making in the coming years. Look for new global cooperative approaches to clean energy systems, medicines and vaccines, improved techniques for fish farming drought-and-temperature resistant crop varieties, highmileage automobiles, and low-cost irrigation tech-

Rich countries should fund these efforts heavily, and they should be carried out in collaboration with poor countries and the private sector. Successful technological breakthroughs can provide stunning benefits for humani-

This will be an exciting time to be a scientist or engineer facing the challenges of sustainable development.

# We'll save the planet only if we're forced to

buy to make sure it is green and planet-friendly? Do you buy carbon offsets every time you fly? Stop. It is time to be honest: green consumerism is at best a draining distraction, and at worst a con. While the planet's fever gets worse by the week, we are guzzling down green-coloured place-bos and calling it action. There is another way. Our reaction to global warming has gone in waves. First we were in blank denial: How can releasing an odourless, colourless gas change the climate so dramatically? Now we are in a phase of displacement: We assume we can warming, by shovelling a few new light bulbs and some carbon offsets into our shopping

This is a self-harming delusion. It's hard to give a sense of the contrast today between the magnitude of our problem, and the weediness of our response so far. But the best way is offered by the Nobel Prize-winning scientist Paul Crutzen.

He explains that until 10,000 years ago, the planet's climate would fluctuate violently: Sometimes it would eer by 12 degrees centigrade in just a decade. This meant it was impossible to develop agriculture. Crops couldn't be cultivated in this climatic chaos, so human beings were stuck as a tiny smattering of hunter-gatherers.

But then the climate settled down into safe parameters - and humans could settle down too. This period is called the Holocene, and it meant that for the first time, we could develop farming and cities. Everything we know as human civilisation is thanks to this unprecedented period of climatic stability

Today, we are bringing this era to an end. By pump ing vast amounts of warming gases into the atmosphere, we are creating a new era: the Anthropocene, in which man makes the weather. There is an imminent danger of it bursting beyond these safe parameters, and bringing about a return to the violent, volatile variations that prevented our ancestors from progressing beyond spears and sticks.

Those are the stakes. Every week, there is greater evidence that we are nudging further from our safety zon The hottest year of the 20th century - 1947 - is now merely the average for the

And what are we doing? Many good, well-intentioned people are beginning to grasp this problem and then assuming green consumerism is the only answer to hand. They shop around for items have not been freighted thousands of miles to make it to their supermarket shelves. They change their light bulbs They turn down the thermostat a few degrees. They make sure they buy products that don't sit on electricity-burning standby all day. They buy the more energy-efficient cars, and scorn SUV drivers.

No need to attack these ly essential part of any solution. But we have to be hon-

est.
This is not even the beginning of a solution — and by pouring so much energy into t, we may actually be forestalling the real solution. A huge number of people are known who are sincerely worried about global warming, but they assume they have done their bit through these shifted consumption patterns. The truth is: You

In reality, dispersed consumer choices are not going to keep the climate this side of a disastrous temperature rise. The only way that can ever happen is by governments legislating to force us green and anti-green to shift towards cleaner behaviour. Just as the govern-

ment in the World War II did not ask people to eat less vol-untarily, governments today cannot ask us to burn fewer

greenhouse gases voluntarily.
It is not enough for you to change your bulbs. Everyone has to change their bulbs. It is not enough for you to eat less meat. Everyone has to eat less meat. It is not enough for you to fly less Everyone has to fly less. (And yes, I hate these facts as much as you do. But I will hate the reality of runaway global warming even

The only way we will get to the situation where we are all required by law to burn fewer greenhouse gases is if enough people pressure the government, demanding it. Green consumer choices often drain away people's political energies to do this. You have a limited amount of time to spend on any political cause. If you have an hour a week to dedicate to acting on global warming, and you spend it scouring the supermarket shelves for the product shipped the shortest distance, that time and energy is gone; you feel you've done what you can. Part of you might also assume: I've made these choices; other people will too; in time, we'll all be persuaded. But we don't have

There is a much better way for you to reduce the amount of greenhouse gases in the atmosphere. Every minute you would have spent shopping around for a greener choice, you should spend volunteering for Greenpeace, or Friends of the Earth, or Plane Stupid, or the Campaign Against Climate Change. Every hundred-pound premi um you would spend to buy a greener product, donate it to them instead. Why? Because by becoming part of this col-lective action — rather than by clinging to dispersed per sonal choices — you will help to change the law, so everyone will have to be greener, not just nice people

like you.

It works. Green campaigners from Australia to Canada to Japan have successfully banned the old light bulbs, so only the energy-saving light bulbs are on offer there now. Green campaigners have prompted the Mayor of London to force SUV drivers to pay a punitive £6,000-a-year premium to drive through our city, forcing many of them to shift to greener cars. These are the first tiny steps towards banning — or massively restrict-ing — the other technologies that are unleashing Weather of Mass Destruction.

Of course, some sincere and well-intentioned people have libertarian concerns about this approach at first glance. Why should we force people to choose the green option? Isn't it better to on persuasion and voluntary

But even the most hardcore libertarians agree that your personal liberty ends where you actively harm the liberty of another person. Greenhouse gas emissions are undeniably harming tens of millions of people - and endangering the ground on which all human liberty rests: a stable and safe clima

Just as no libertarian would argue you should have the right to buy and fire a nuclear weapon, no libertarian should argue you have the right to burn unlimited greenhouse gases.

#### Viral fever hits Delhiites: no reason for worry, say docs

**NEW DELHI** — As Delhi warmed up for summer, a different strain of viral fever has hit its denizens but doctors are not yet sounding alarm bell. People down with viral fever are complaining of lesser chill accompanied by the other usual symptoms such as body ache, nausea and chest congestion. "Be it virus or bacteria, they have many strains. Each strain produces its own set of symptoms. That is why, every year we hear of different symptoms of viral fever," said Dr Bir Singh, convenor, Disease Outbreak Cell, AIIMS. He, however, said no pathological tests have been conducted and no samples sent to labs so far. "The fever is prevalent for a week and then it is gone," Bir said. A doctor at the National Institute of Communicable Diseases said there was nothing serious about the viral fever. "Those who are already unwell are likely to be affected more. So, they need to be careful during the change of season cases are reported during this time," said Dr S.P. Byotra, a senior doctor in the Department of Medicine, Sir Ganga Ram Hospital. Chest clinics in government hospitals are open for longer hours and the queues in front of the physicians' clinics too are not short.

#### 5 children die after eating 'prasadam' in Bihar

PATNA — Five children have died and 96 other people have fallen seriously ill after eating sweets and rice offered to a deity at a village shrine, health officials said yesterday. Children in Isua village, in Bihar, fell sick on Thursday during a festival to mark the full moon shortly after eating the temple offerings, known as *prasad*, made to Saraswati, the deity of learning. "The children began vomiting and falling on the groundsenseless," Ramvilas Ranjan, a health official in the district, said by telephone. The dead children were between 4 and 7 years old. Most of those taken sick are also children. Ranjan thinks it was probably food poisoning.
Villagers told him the food had been kept in a store room for ten days. Tests are being done on the prasad.

# Life is bitter-sweet for working couples!

NEW DELHI - Double income couples in India are indeed leading a bit-ter-sweet life — one in three such couples believe that divergent opinion due to two careers raises divorce chances, but a majority of over eight in ten are still satisfied with their work-family

According to a survey conducted by global research firm Synovate for the country's leading staffing firm TeamLease Services, the overall satisfaction level of married working couples is as high as 87 per cent across

At the same time, the survey found that 34 per cent of the couples felt that two careers "substantially increase the chances of a difference of opinion leading to divorce."

While those seeing higher chances of divorce due to both partners being in jobs were still in a minority, a majority of 63 per cent agreed that fights were common on issues like quality time and work travel in such families.

Delhi emerged as the only exception where only about 56 per cent respondents disagreed about fights being common in the double-income

working corporate executives married with or without kids across five cities — Delhi, Mumbai, Bangalore, Pune, and Hyderabad.

Notwithstanding the high satisfac-tion levels about the overall work-life balance, a majority of 52 per cent said that, given a chance, they would go for a "less lavish life" with one spouse working but satisfactory marital rela-

Those living in Pune and Delhi came tops in terms of preference for a luxury life, while people in Hyderabad, Bangalore and Mumbai mostly voted in favour of single income but satisfactory marital rela-

In Delhi, 66 per cent prefer a double-income luxury life, while it is as high as 88 per cent in Pune. However, 95 per cent of Hyderabadis said they wanted a single-income, less lavish

According to the survey, while a growing number of men are becoming actively involved in sharing family responsibilities, including rearing a child, a large number of such couples have become "week-end parents."

Across the country at least 54 per cent of those surveyed said they were becoming "week-end parents", with Bangalore and Mumbai as exceptions and Pune, Hyderabad and Delhi coming on the top of the heap.

The survey comes amid a sharp

surge in the number of working couples with increased urbanisation, lower education dropout by women and the need for two incomes driving higher labour force participation by women.

"This survey highlights the bitter-sweet implications of two careers. The stress on marriages and childcare is often perceived to blunt the economic upside," TeamLease's Permanent Staffing General Manager Surabhi

"The continued difficulties for women looking to re-enter the work-force after a child break and the high unwillingness to move cities to follow their spouses' careers highlights the continued challenges for women spouses in the Indian workplace," Mathur said

Barring Delhi and Pune, in other ities both spouses share the responsibility to take care of the child.

As much as 43 per cent of Delhi parents do not attend their children's school function. However, 46 per cent others in Delhi and 78 per cent in Pune attend such functions.

The verdict was divided on whether

working in same organisation improves or reduces the quality of work-life balance. While 48 per cent said it led to improvement, 21 per cent voted against it and another 26 per cent did not see any impact at all.

However, a vast majority of 70 per cent replied in the affirmative when asked whether the Indian companies had flexible working policies for employees to maintain a work-life bal-ance. The satisfaction level on this front was highest in Pune (88 per cent), while Mumbai came at the bottom (64 per cent).

"Companies that think creatively and deeply about infrastructure for two-career couples have a unique opportunity to not only increase gender diversity but also draft labour mar ket outside to tackle the skill shortage," TeamLease's Mathur noted

In terms of overall satisfaction level for their own work-life balance, Pune (96 per cent) came tops, followed by Hyderabad (92 per cent) and Delhi (91 per cent), while Bangalore emerged as 79 per cent approving of their work-life balance.

At least 48 per cent of the couples polled said they would willingly follow their spouses to other cities for career, but a higher proportion of 52 per cent are not willing to hamper their career for the sake of their spouses

Couples in all the cities polled agreed that working in odd shift hours had an impact on their marital relationships, barring New Delhi, where most of the respondents said they do not work in shifts. — *PTI*

#### Despite red flags, Lalu gets his Bihar projects cleared: Sources

NEW DELHI — If Railway Minister Lalu Prasad Yaday has his way, his home state Bihar is set to bag almost 45 per cent of the "New Line" railway projects likely to be announced in this year's rail budget. Sources said that "at least 10 of the 25odd new line railway projects" Lalu is likely to read out from his budget speech on February 26 are located in Bihar. These projects in Bihar amount to Rs40 billion. The new

lines include: Sitamarhi-Jaynagar-Nirmali via Susand, Muzaffarpur-Katra-Orai-Janakpur Road, Gaya to Daltonganj and Darbhanga-Muzaffarpur. Almost all these projects have a negative rate of return prompting the Finance Ministry and the Planning Commission to raise red flags. But Lalu got the decks cleared by getting them approved by the Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs (CCEA) on Thursday. Indian Railways have fixed a rate of return of 14 per cent to decide the viability of a project. A project having a negative rate of return means that the operating losses would skyrocket as and when the project is completed. Already saddled with a crammed shelf of pending projects, Railways nowadays only consider projects having a minimum 14 per cent rate of return. By arrangement with The Indian Express

#### SC takes serious exception to Raj Thackeray's remarks

NEW DELHI — The Supreme Court vesterday took serious note of the controversial remarks of Maharashtra Navnirman Sena (MNS) chief Raj Thackeray relating to north Indians and warned that "Balkanisation" of the country would not be allowed

"We can understand what is happening. We will not allow/permit Balkanisation of this country," a bench headed by Chief Justice K. G. Balakrishnan said. Expressing displeasure over Thackeray's statements that allegedly resulted in violence and attacks against north Indians in Mumbai and other parts of Maharashtra, the bench said "it is a dangerous tendency." This is the country and him till get account of the said.

"This is one country and we will not accept sons-of-the-soil theory," the bench, also comprising Justices R.V. Ravindran and Markandev Katiu, observed. The bench, however, refused to pass any direction on two PILs relating to the issue saying since the matter primarily relates to law and order situation, it could be brought to the notice of the state government and petitioners could approach the Bombay High Court.

"It is not possible for this court to give a direction on law and

order situation," the bench said and also declined to accept the contention that a direction was required to the Election Commission to derecognise MNS as a political party in view of the statements of Raj. "You have to make a representation before the Election Commission for derecognising a political party. How can this court issue mandamus when you have not gone to the EC," the bench said. The PIL filed by advocate Arvind Shukla had sought a direction to the EC to derecognise Raj Thackeray's party over his controversial remarks against north Indians. Another advocate, Rakesh Uttamchandra Upadhyay, had sought a direction to the governments to provide security to residents from other state in view of the recent attacks on north Indians. — PTI

surgery immediately.

The father was in a thankful mood. "I am extremely surprised, but happy that my son is showing signs of improvement after surgery," said Zairullah, who had his left leg amputated at Lahore's Shaukat Khanum Hospital six

months ago.

The baby is still weak and receiving blood transfusions as well as antibiotics. Dr Ikram said the 'other

baby' was attached to the mesentery of (Abbas's) small intestine through a pedicle supplying blood."

# Prime minister's mantle may fall on Fahim

ISLAMABAD — Pakistan's two biggest opposition parties sought to thrash out their choice for premier yesterday after agreeing to form a coalition government that could President Pervez Musharraf from power.

Ex-premier Nawaz Sharif and the widowed husband of slain opposition leader Benazir Bhutto said their parties once bitter rivals would join forces after trouncing Musharraf's allies in elections earlier in the week.

Officials from both parties said the frontrunner to be minister Makhdoom Amin Fahim, the widely respected vice-president of Benazir's Pakistan People's Party (PPP).

A senior PPP official said Benazir's widower, Asif Ali Zardari, and Sharif "discussed the name of Makhdoom Amin Fahim as the future premier' during their meeting late on

It is expected that he will get his party's nomination today," the party official said. The proposed alliance

between the parties brings them nearer the two-thirds majority they would need to seek Musharraf's impeachment, leaving the US ally in the most precarious position since he seized power in a 1999 coup. Musharraf vowed in an

opinion article for the Washington Post to work with the new parliament to tackle the three key tasks he said were facing Pakistan: defeating terrorism; forging a stable vernment: and creating the foundation for sustained economic growth.

"Because these goals are shared by the vast majority of Pakistanis, I am certain we can and will accomplish them, and I stand ready to work with the newly elected rliament to achieve these objectives," he wrote.

All the PPP's members of

yesterday in Islamabad to discuss the agreement between Zardari and Sharif, party spokesman Farhatullah Babar said. Neither Zardari nor Sharif are immediately eligible to be premier because they are not MPs — Sharif was barred from standing, and Benazir's husband did not do so because his wife was still alive when nomination papers

Benazir, whose party will be the biggest in parliament following the general elections on Monday, was assassinated in a suicide attack at a political rally in December.

Either of the men could

still contest upcoming by-elections for seats left vacant by candidates who stood and won - in two constituen-

cies at the same time. Fahim stood against Musharraf in October's presidential election but later withdrew, protesting that Musharraf was not eligible to contest because he was still army chief at the time.

Musharraf, still seen in Washington as a bulwark against Al Qaeda and the Taleban, resigned as head of the military in November after winning a second five-

year term as president.

Another name under consideration to be PM is senior

PPP member Shah Mehmood Qureshi, the official said.

But there remain questions

over whether their coalition will press for the former general's immediate ouster from office, and whether they will deposed chief justice.

"The people gave a clear verdict on February 18, which shows that they do not want Musharraf," Sharif said yesterday, but he skirted round the issue of whether the coalition would go for impeach-

The PPP's Babar for his part said the matter "will be taken up by the next parliament. It is premature to talk about it now." The announcement by Zardari and Sharif of a coalition came after reported efforts by Musharraf to get

Sharif said on Thursday that they had overcome differ ences over his demands for the immediate restoration of chief justice Iftikhar Chaudhary, who was sacked by Musharraf in November, and would work on it in par-liament. If Chaudhary, who remains under house arrest, gets his job back, he could overturn Musharraf's controversial presidential election victory and oust him from office. — AFP

#### **Decades of enmity** could hobble coalition

ISLAMABAD - After two decades of bickering and ousting each other, the parties of Pakistan's slain opposition leader Benazir Bhutto and Nawaz Sharif now face a struggle to work together in their newly-formed coalition, analysts say

Benazir's widowed husband Asif Ali Zardari spent a total of 11 years in prison under previous Sharif administrations but he sat side-by-side with his former rival on Thursday night and iced they would join forces

Their groupings, Benazir's Pakistan People's Party (PPP) and Sharif's Pakistan Muslim League-N (PML-N) emerged the win-Shahi s ransaal Mushin League-1 (FML-IV) enleged the Wil-ners after trouncing President Pervez Musharraf's allies in Monday's parliamentary elections. Observers say their coalition government could drive Musharraf from power. But first it has to stay together. Shafqat Mahmood, a political commentator and newspaper columnist, said the confrontation in the 1990s between the Bhuttos and Sharif "was very sharp, akin to warfare". Both sides conspired with anti-democratic forces to bring each other's regimes down, he said.

"Hopefully they will not do it now and they have learned a lesson from it," Mahmood said.

Enmity between the two sides goes back decades because Benazir's father, the late premier Zulfiqar Ali Bhutto, nationalised the industries of Sharif's father.

As a result, late military dictator Ziaul Haq Zulfiqar Bhutto excuted in 1977 — handpicked Sharif as the youngest-ever finance minister of Punjab province in 1981. Sharif won elections for prime minister after Benazir Bhutto's dismissal from the post in 1990. Zardari was then arrested and spent three years in jail on corruption allegations — until Sharif himself was sacked on corruption charges.

Sharif bounced back to the premiership in 1996 after the then-president dismissed Benazir as prime minister for a second time. Zardari was arrested before elections, which Sharif won. He levelled charges of corruption against Benazir and Zardari, who remained in jail until 2004 when Musharraf released him. Benazir fled abroad and both were convicted in absentia in 1999 before

Musharraf overthrew Sharif in a counter-coup.

Benazir's death last December in a gun and suicide attack at a campaign rally overshadowed the election campaign.

campaign raily oversnadowed the electron campaign.

After years of animosity the first signs of cooperation between the two camps — who were both in exile — emerged in 2006 when they signed a Charter of Democracy.

It pledged to restore democracy to Pakistan, to avoid confrontation, and to abolish the military's role in politics.

#### Polls raise hopes of peace with India

WAGAH — Every evening as dusk falls on the India-Pakistan border post near Lahore, crowds gather on either side of the frontier and scream slogans at each other in a choreographed show

"Long Live Pakistan!" some shout from the stands as patriotic music blasts through a stadi-um. Similar cries ring out from India, while men on both sides frantically wave flags, trying to outdo each other in nationalistic fervou

Immaculately dressed soldiers then lower both national flags, marking the closure of the order between two countries who have been at odds since independence from Britain and partition in 1947. India and Pakistan have fought three wars, two over the disputed territory of Kashmir. The countries came to the brink of war again in the aftermath of a deadly attack on India's parliament in December 2001, which New Delhi blamed on Pakistan-based militants.

India snapped diplomatic, transport and trade links but in January 2004 the two countries agreed to a peace process which has

trudged along since.

Many people who rely on the border cross ing here hope that the new Pakistani government voted in Monday's elections would speed up thawing relations between the historic rivals. India on Wednesday welcomed the elections

in Pakistan and said it hoped to see fresh talks with its nuclear-armed south Asian rival. "If there is a real democracy then there will be a good relationship between India and

#### Restoring sacked judges a litmus test for PPP

ISLAMABAD — Slain former prime minister Benazir Bhutto's kistan People's Party has emerged as the largest party in the National Assembly after this week's parliamentary elections but is faced with a major dilemma: restoration of 60 judges controver sially sacked by President Pervez Musharraf. The party, led now by co-chairman Asif Ali Zardari, can make history by joining hands with former prime minister Nawaz Sharif's Pakistan Muslim League-N for the restoration of supreme and high court judges as has been mandated by two-thirds of the vote in favour of this issue. However, the PPP may be reluctant to do this in favour of cohabiting with Musharraf who as president is opposed to restoration of the judges and wields the power to sack the government and dissolve parliament. Musharraf, as serving army chief on November 3, 2007, had sacked more than 60 judges of the superior courts who had refused to take fresh oath under the controversial Provisional Constitutional Order (PCO) that effected a state of emergency. "The choice is with the PPP whether to join the democratic forces or to save the sinking ship of the incumbent ruler," an independent analyst said. But the PPP leaders do not see any possibility of joining hands with the pro-Musharraf forces to establish a PPP government at the centre.

It is not possible for any one to blackmail the PPP and the party is unlikely to team up with pro-Musharraf forces to form a government, sources within the PPP say. - Internews

# Vote could curtail US drone attacks

WASHINGTON — American officials reached a quiet understanding with Pakistan's leader last month to intensify secret strikes against sus-pected terrorists by pilot-less aircraft launched inside Pakistan, senior officials in both governments say. But the prospect of changes in Pakistan's government has the Bush administration worried that the new operations could be

Among other things, the new arrangements allowed an increase in the number and scope of patrols and strikes by armed Predator surveillance aircraft launched from a secret base inside Pakistan — a far more aggressive strategy to attack Al Qaeda and the Taleban than had exist-

ed before. But since opposition parties emerged victorious from the parliamentary election early this week. American officials are worried that the new, more permissive arrangement could be

choked off in its infancy.

In the weeks before Monday's election, a series of meetings among President Bush's national security advisers resulted in a significant relaxation of the rules under which American forces could aim attacks at suspected Al Qaeda and Taleban fighters in the tribal areas near Pakistan's border with Afghanistan. The change, described by senior American and Pakistani officials who would not speak for attribution because of the classified nature of the programme, allows American military commanders greater leeway to choose from what one official who took part in the debate called

Instead of having to confirm the identity of a pected militant leader before attacking, this shift allowed American operators to strike convoys of vehicles that bear the characteristics of Al Qaeda or Taleban leaders on the run, for instance, so long as the risk of civilian casualties is judged to be low.

The new, looser rules of engagement may

have their biggest impact at a secret CIA base in Pakistan whose existence was described by American and Pakistani officials who had previously kept it secret to avoid embarrassing President Pervez Musharraf politically. Musharraf, whose party lost in this week's election by margins that surprised American officials, has been accused by political rivals of being too close to the United States

The base in Pakistan is home to a handful of Predators — pilot-less aircraft that are controlled from the United States. Two Hellfire missiles from one of those Predators are believed to have killed a senior Al Oaeda comnander, Abu Laith Al Libbi, in northwest Pakistan last month, though a senior Pakistani official said his government had still not con-firmed that Libbi was among the dead. A CIA spokesman declined on Thursday to comment

on any operations in Pakistan. The new agreements with Pakistan came after a trip to the country on January 9 by Mike McConnell, the director of national intelligence,

and General Michael V. Hayden, the CIA direc tor. The American officials met with Musharrat as well as with the new army chief, General Ashfaq Parvez Kayani, and offered a range of increased covert operations aimed at thwarting intensifying efforts by Al Qaeda and the Taleban to destabilise the Pakistani government. But Bush administration officials and American counter-terrorism experts are expressing concern that these arrangements could come under review or be scaled back by the winners of Pakistan's parliamentary elections. The two winning parties have said they want to enter talks with Pashtun tribal leaders who opposed Musharraf's government and who at times have supported the Taleban and given refuge to foreign Al Qaeda fighters.

'A new government may be able to reach an accord with the militants, and that would buy the government a certain respite," said Robert L. Grenier, a former director of the Central Intelligence Agency's Counter-terrorism

#### 46 killed in Venezuela plane crash

BARINAS (Venezuela) — A Venezuelan passenger plane slammed into a steep Andean mountainside shortly after takeoff from a nearby tourist city and all 46 people on board were killed, rescue offi-

cials said yesterday.

Search teams spotted the wreckage from a helicopter flying over high-altitude mountains. Helicopter pilot Jhonny Paz said the plan was "pulverised" and there were no survivors

'There is minimal chance of any survivors," said Gerardo Rojas, a regional civil defence chief. "The plane is just too destroyed and it is in such a tough area.

The twin-engine plane crashed just a few kilometres from the mountain tourist city of Merida, notoriously difficult for pilots to navigate around, after taking off for the capital Caracas on Thursday

Recovery of the bodies and wreckage would be diffi-cult because there were no obvious areas for aircraft to land nearby in the rugged ter-

"The zone is completely inaccessible." said Ivar Altuve, a search team coordinator working from the city of Barinas in

Search teams had trekked overnight through rugged ter-rain and at daylight on Friday aircraft scoured the Andes.

There was no evidence the pilot made distress calls to air traffic controllers before it crashed about 13,000 feet (4,000 metres) above sea level, officials said.

Mountain villagers reported hearing a huge noise they thought could be a crash soon after the disappearance of flight 518, local civil defence official Gerardo Rojas said.

# **Snubs and omissions taint** Oscar foreign film award

ter which movie wins the Oscar for best foreign language film tomorrow, critics and fans may remember this year for work that was snubbed or disqualified by

Academy Award voters.

The film industry has expanded rapidly around the world in recent years and the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences's foreign film honour has grown increasingly important as a platform where filmmakers can launch careers. But this year, several acclaimed films in world cinema failed to earn nominations, causing some critics to cry foul.

The most conspicuous absence is Romanian abortion drama 4 Months, 3 Weeks and 2 Days which Scott Foundas film editor for the *LA Weekly* newspaper, called "the foreign film of the year by unan-imous acclaim." It won top honours at the Cannes Film critics awards

"It taints the whole race so that no matter who wins, peo-ple will always wonder 'What if 4 Months, 3 Weeks and 2 Days or Persepolis or other noteworthy omissions had been in the race?" Foundas

Like 4 Months France's coming-of-age tale *Persepolis* didn't even make the shortlist of contenders from the record 63 submissions around the world. It was, however, nominated for best animated

Perhaps the most controversial absence involved the disqualification of Israel's *The Band's Visit* because more than 50 per cent of the dialogue between an Egyptian band and Israeli villagers is in English, albeit mostly broken

The five films that did earn nominations were The Counterfeiters from Austria,

Kazakhstan's Mongol.

There is a consensus that this is an embarrassing selection and it exposed the cate-gory as by far the most problematic one the Academy has," said Robert Koehler, a film critic for show business newspaper Variety.



Environment Secretary Hilary Benn, who has already named Adair Turner to head the committee, said scientists Brian Hoskins and Robert May, technologist Jim Skea and economists Sam Fankhauser and Michael Grubb would make up the new commit-tee. The climate change bill will set a legallybinding target of a 60 per cent cut from 1990 lev els in national carbon dioxide emissions by 2050 with an interim target of 26-32 per cent by 2020. It is expected to become law within three months

The committee will be a fundamental pillar of the way we tackle climate change from now until 2050." said Benn.

"The founding members of the committee are leading experts in their fields, and they will make a vital contribution in our efforts to build a low

Benn said earlier this week he would ask the committee to review the 60 per cent target by the end of the year and recommend whether it should be raised to the 80 per cent demanded by environmentalists. The government has been under relentless pressure both to raise the core target and to set annual reduction targets rather than the

more vague rolling five-year carbon budgets Proposing several amendments to the bill as it heads through the parliamentary process, Benn said on Monday the rolling budgets would remain but there would also be indicative annual ranges within them to make monitoring more meaning

"Victims of crime will be outraged at the suggestion that criminals should be spared jail simply because of this government's incompetence in failing to provide sufficient prison places," he said.

"The prisons are literally full, but instead of doing its duty and securing emergency capacity to protect the public, the government's response is to give criminals a break.

With the prison population at a record high, Straw said non-custodial sentences can be more effective than short jail terms for some offend-

"We have 350 magistrates courts in England and Wales. If each one ends up sentencing one e extra prisoner a week to jail then we have got the increase we face," Straw said in an interview published in vesterday's Guardian.

"There are effective alternatives in terms of non-custodial penalties which actually have a better record in terms of preventing reoffending than short prison sentences." There are 82,000 inmates in prisons in England and Wales, fuelled by a rise of more than 2,000 since Christmas, he added. The rise was due to more adult men being sent to prison by magistrates and a rise in the number of ex-prisoners being sent back to jail for breaking the terms of their release. Some prisons house three inmates in each cell designed for one person, he added.

# Chef found guilty of model's murder

In a defence labelled by prosecutors as "desperate," Dixie told the jury he had stumbled on the blonde's naked corpse by chance as he staggered home drunk and high on cocaine after celebrating his birthday.

He claimed he did not realise she was dead until after he stopped having sex with

Bowman, who was working as a hairdresser and part-time model at the time of her death, was discovered by a neighbour. DNA tests on semen linked Dixie with

her dead body, which was found with stab wounds in the neck and abdomen.

His DNA had been taken after he was arrested in a pub fight in Surrey in June 2006. When the match was made, he was arrested within five hours, police sources

# Manila rice plea a wake-up call

MANILA — The Philippines' unusual plea for Hanoi to guarantee rice supplies is the clearest sign of a growing global anxiety over how nations will feed their people

President Gloria Macapagal-Arroyo had contacted Vietnamese Prime Minister Nguyen Tan Dung to see if he could pledge an undisclosed supply of rice, officials said on Thursday, an exceptional move in a market that normally operates on a purely commercial basis among traders or state procurement agenc

It was not the first time an Asian govern-ment has taken action in the face of soaring grain prices and growing fears over the security of food supplies. India has restricted some rice exports, Indonesia has raised taxes on palm oil shipments and Malaysia is building up stocks.

But Gloria appears to be the first to take an overtly political route to allay fears that the Philippines, whose rapidly expanding population is among the most dependent on imports, could run short of its staple national food

"This is a wake-up call," Robert Zeigler, director-general of the Philippines-based International Rice Research Institute (IRRI), said vesterday, "We have a crisis brewing in terms of rice Nearly half the planet's 6.6 billion people depend on rice to survive but rising populations and economic growth mean that the world is already eating more of the grain than is harvested. Vietnam, the world's second-biggest exporter, has put a temporary ban on shipments to meet domestic demand between harvests. World stocks of the grain are currently around 72 million tonnes, their lowest levels since the early- to mid-1970s when food shortages triggered a devastating famine in Bangladesh.

Zeigler said other importing nations in sub-Saharan Africa and Asia could also be at risk and as soon as this year.

Bangladesh is currently scrambling to secure supplies of rice after a devastating cyclone last year washed away about I million tonnes of the grain. The rising price of food has triggered protests in Indonesia and Jakarta is having to hike its food subsidy bill by over a third to around 9 trillion rupiah this year, partly due to climbing prices. China, a net exporter of corn, rice and wheat in 2007, has removed import taxes, raised export taxes and imposed export quotas on grains and flour due to red-

Average rice prices have nearly doubled to around \$393 per tonne in the past five years but yields are plateauing as rapid urbanisation shrinks available farmland and diverts water and labour away from production. Meanwhile soaring grains prices are also driving up competition for arable land. — Reuters

Political analysts, however,

why Ramos would not attend the event in EDSA since "Ramos is for the status quo." Malay was referring to Ramos' repeated declarations that that he was still supporting President Gloria Macapagal-Arroyo despite the ZTE contract scandal "in the absence of a better alternative.'

Gloria, whose political party KAMPI is expected to coalesce with the ruling Lakas party for the 2010 presidential election, is Lakas chair while Ramos is chair emeritus.

Ramos earlier said the "communal action" and street marches in the search of the truth behind the scapped ZTE deal with China would not be enough to spark another people power revolution.

On the other hand, Aquino, hailed as an icon of Philippine democracy, will attend the mass with Makati City Mayor Jejomar Binay and other key opposition figures who were invited to grace the affair. Senate star witness in the ongoing national broadband network scandal Rodolfo Lozada Jr. is also expected to attend.

#### Floods, landslides leave 21 dead

MANILA - At least 21 people have been killed and more than 294,000 displaced by floods and landslides in the central and southern Philippines, relief officials said yesterday.

The civil defence office and the local Red Cross reported 15

dead and four missing in the central islands and the Bicol peninsula, southeast of Manila

Another six people died in the southern island of Mindanac after heavy rains lashed the area this week.

Most of the dead in the central islands were drowned by flash-floods while those in Mindanao were killed by a landslide, the civil defence office said. It said in a statement that it would also conduct an aerial survey of the affected areas to determine the extent of flooding and landslides. A military C-130 flew to the central island of Samar, which bore the brunt of the storms, to deliver relief goods, the office added. The Red Cross, the social welfare department and other relief agencies are also distributing food and relief goods in other affected areas. - AFP

#### **Outlook dims amid political unrest**

MANILA — Business confidence in the Philippines has suffered a knock due to growing political unrest and an economic slowdown in the United States, according to a central bank industry survey released vesterday.

Firms cited "local political noise", concerns over a possible US recession, reduced export competitiveness due to the strong seso, and a relentless surge in oil prices, for their "cautious outook," the monetary authority said in a statement.

The first quarter survey was made as President Gloria Arovo tries to fight off fresh corruption allegations following a robust 2007 that saw economic growth reach a 31-year high 7.3 per cent, a 20-year low inflation rate of 2.8 per cent and the lowest budget deficit in 10 years. - AFP

# LTTE says air raid killed 8 civilians

COLOMBO - Tamil Tiger rebels said Sri Lankan gov-ernment fighter jets killed eight civilians, including ee young children, in an air raid on their northern stronghold vesterday.

Fighting between the military and the Liberation Tigers of Tamil Eelam has intensified since the government for-mally pulled out of a six-yearold ceasefire pact in January, though a renewed war has been raging since 2006.

The Air Force said it had bombed and destroyed an isolated rebel boat yard housing vessels used in suicide mis sions in the village of Kiranchi, west of the Tigers' de facto capital of Kilinochchi, yesterday morning. It declined to comment on the Tiger assertion.

"Eight civilians, including three preschool children were killed and 10 more were injured four of them critically, when Sri Lanka bombed a coastal civilian settlement in the Kiranchi area," the Tigers' Peace Secretariat said in an email.

The Tigers were not immediately contactable by telephone. As with a Defence Ministry claim that troops killed 92 rebels in a northern offensive earlier this week and tolls from countless clashes in recent months, there was no independent confirmation of what happened or how many people were killed.

President Mahinda Rajapakse's government argues the Tigers used the truce to re-arm and were not sincere about talking peace. It has vowed to crush them mil-itarily, and has captured large swathes of rebel-held territory But analysts say neither

side is winning, with the Tigers regularly hitting back with suicide attacks and roadside bombs. The violence hurt tourist

arrivals last year, which fell 12 per cent from a year earlier, while the stock market slid nearly 7 per cent in 2007, with some businesses shelving investment plans.

The latest fighting came as UN Assistant Secretary-General for Political Affairs Angela Kane visited the Indian Ocean island nation to assess world the body's oper ations for Secretary-General Ban ki-Moon

It also came a day after US-based Human Rights Watch called on the UN Security Council to impose sanctions on the Tigers and a splinter faction seen as allied to the government for using children as soldiers.

Human Rights Watch also

called on the Security Council to publicly condemn the Sri Lankan government, saying it was failing to investigate cases of child abduction and recruitment in territory it con-

It also wants the government reprimanded, accusing elements of the security forces of complicity in abduction of children by the splinter 'Karuna' faction, which analysts say helped the government to evict the Tigers from the east. - Reuters

#### Myanmar democratic process should be inclusive: UN envoy

JAKARTA — The UN envoy

to Myanmar, Ibrahim Gambari, said yesterday that the country should follow an inclusive process as it moves towards multi-party elections in 2010. The junta announced earlier this month that it would hold a referendum on a new constitution in May to set the stage for polls. But Foreign Minister Nvan Win said this week that the document would ban widowed democracy leader Aung San Suu Kyi from running as she had been married to a foreigner. "We have been very consistent in saying that the recent announcement by the authorities of the referendum on the government constitution in May, and elections that will lead to a multi-party democracy in 2010, are a notentially significant step,'

'But all the process has to be credible and has to be all-inclusive. This will continue to be stressed in our conversation with the authorities in Myanmar,"
Gambari told a press briefing after meeting Indonesian President Susilo Bambang Yudhoyono.

They were the envoy's first comments since the junta revealed Suu Kvi would be blocked from the elections

But they echoed remarks by UN chief Ban Ki-moon who called on Myanmar's military regime to foster an inclusive process after it announced plans for the constitutional referendum.

Gambari, who is on a regional visit to consult Asian nations on Myanmar and its so-called "road map" to democracy, did not mention Aung San Suu Kvi by name Yudhoyono, meanwhile, wel-comed the announcement of Myanmar's referendum and elections but also called for them to be inclusive, spokesman said. — AFP

#### China asks websites to eradicate porn, violence

BEIJING - China has called on domestic websites to sign a voluntary pact governing online video and audio content, saying they should exercise self-censorship to ensure a "healthy and orderly"

The move is part of government efforts to exert greater control over China's rapidly growing internet sector, and to prevent content deemed harmful or subversive from getting into the public

Eight "central" websites yesterday signed the pact requiring them to eradicate pornography and violence, which had "seriously polluted the online environment and affected the growth of young people", the national broadcast watchdog said

The signatories should actively disseminate healthy, beneficial audio-visual programmes meeting socialist moral norms," reads the text of the pact drafted by the State Administration of Radio, Film and Television.

"Decadent backward thoughts and culture must be boycotted by all," according to a copy of the pact posted on the administra-tion's website. Content related to gambling and "horror" were also targeted. - Reuters

Wallace is a four-time NBA All-Star and Defensive Player of the Year but he has struggled this season in Chicago. He has played in 50 games this season with the Bulls, averaging 5.1 points, 8.8 rebounds

#### Singapore begins countdown to inaugural Youth Olympics

SINGAPORE — Singapore started its countdown yesterday to the 2010 Youth Olympics, vowing to justify a decision by the International Olympic Committee to hand the inaugural event to the tiny city-state. Singapore beat Moscow by a vote of 53 to 44 late on Thursday, with newspapers calling it arguably the biggest day in the country's sporting history. "It's Singapore 2010," the top-selling *Straits Times* yelled on its front page. "An honour and a privilege for everyone, now for the countdown to the main event. The city-state is, by international standards, already an Olympian city in finance, tourism, education, bio-tech and only in inflate, tourish, education, obs-teen research and bold ideas," it added in an editorial. The tabloid *Today* newspaper opted for "A dream come true" across its front page while the newspaper said: "The new goal — 2010." It will be the first time that Singapore has hosted a multi-disciplinary sporting event of such a magnitude. The brainchild of IOC chief Jacques Rogge, the Youth Olympics will feature traditional sports such as athletics and swimming, but also some innovative events such as beach-wrestling and BMX bike-riding.

#### Chelsea will not sign Ronaldinho

LONDON — Chelsea won't try to sign Barcelona star Ronaldinho at the end of the season according to the Premier League club's chairman. Ronaldinho has endured a disappointing campaign with Barca and, after being left out several times by coach Frank Rijkaard, it was suggested the Brazilian was keen to leave the Nou Camp. Chelsea are one of the few clubs who could afford the former World Player of the Year and chairman Bruce Buck admitted they had considered making a bid, before deciding to look elsewhere for new signings. "Ronaldinho? No, I don't see it being likely that Ronaldinho will be here next year," Buck

The visitors' gamble to bowl first — expecting the match to be shortened by the weather — looked to have paid off and they restricted the hosts to just 184 for seven from their 50 overs.





#### \$415 million REC **IPO** oversubscribed by nearly 30 times

MUMBAI — Indian power sector lender REC's initial public offer to raise up to \$415 million was oversubscribed by nearly 30 times, data showed yesterday, despite a weak share market.

State-run Rural Electrification Corp. (REC) is involved in financing distri-bution and generation proj-ects in India which needs more fuel to feed its booming

economy.

The offering, which was oversubscribed 27.3 times, came two weeks after two large IPOs were withdrawn due to a tumble in India's share market.

India's benchmark Sensex share index has fallen more than 18 per cent from a record intra-day high of 21,206.77 on January 10.

"This (REC's) was a strong response considering choppy markets and events in previous weeks," said a banker to the issue on condition of anonymity.

REC was expected to raise a maximum of Rs16.38 billion (\$415 million) at the top end of the price band which was set at Rs90 to Rs105.

The company plans to use the funds to increase capital

and improve borrowing capacity for future expansion

Earlier this month, Emaar MGF Land an Indian joint venture of Dubai's Emaar Properties, pulled its IPO to raise up to \$1.64 billion, citing fears of a global financial 'meltdown.

Emaar's move came after India's Wockhardt Hospitals abandoned its initial public offer to raise \$165 million after it got subscription orders for only a fifth of the issue.

"REC has a strong posi-tioning in the power finance sector and is fairly priced, based on fundamental value," Vaibhav Agrawal, analyst at Angel Broking, said in a note to clients.

Just before the Indian

stock market tumbled over fears of a US recession India's biggest-ever share offer by Reliance Power, controlled by billionaire Anil Ambani, was oversubscribed 73 times as investors scrambled to apply for a slice of the nearly \$3-billion flotation.

The Reliance IPO made financial history in Indian capital markets, including the largest number of applications. — AFP

'Variety' up for sale

LOS ANGELES — The 103-year-old entertainment trade newspaper Variety went on the auction block on Thursday when Anglo-

Dutch company Reed Elsevier put its publishing unit up for sale.

The company said the planned sale was strategic — part of a move from advertising-dependent to subscription-based publications and information services - and no reflection on the performance of its Reed Business Information unit.

'We've taken the decision to get into less cyclical markets where there's less exposure to advertising," spokesman Patrick

Reed Business Information publishes the Variety newspapers and hundreds of other periodicals, including Broadcasting & Cable and Publishers Weekly. The company's revenue in 2007

Charlie Koones, who until December 31 oversaw Reed Business Information's entertainment division as the president and publisher of *Variety*, said the decision to sell illustrated the difficulties facing some print publications. Although Variety's online advertising revenue grew 82 per cent in 2007, its print advertising revenue declined, he said, although he didn't disclose how much. "A buyer is going to have to evaluate what kind of investment he wants to make to drive growth," Koones said.

He called Variety the "crown jewel" of the unit. Variety, a weekly founded in 1905 by the Silverman family to cover Vaudeville from New York, has 21,184 subscribers, a spokeswoman said.

Daily Variety, launched in Hollywood in 1933, has 37,027. There is also a website, Variety.com.

Variety was owned by the Silvermans until 1987, when it was sold for about \$60 million to Cahners Publishing Co., a division of Reed International. Sources close to the company said Variety's annual revenue totalled around \$100 million.

Reed Elsevier announced the planned sale as it disclosed that t would buy Alpharetta, Georgia-based ChoicePoint Inc., the biggest US provider of information services for the insurance ustry, for \$3.5 billion, in addition to almost \$1 billion in net debt. # Microsoft to share more secrets

NEW YORK — Seeking to satisfy European antitrust officials, Microsoft would open up and share many more of its technical secrets with the rest of the software industry and competitors. Microsoft executives, in a conference call, characterised the announcement as a "strategic shift" in the company's business practices and its handling of technical information. They also portrayed the moves as only partly a nod to the continuing challenge Microsoft faces from Europe's antitrust reg-

The broader goal, they said, was to bring Microsoft's flagship personal computer products — the Windows operating system and Office productivity programmes — further into the internet era of computing. Increasingly, people want a seamless flow of documents, data and programming code among desktop PCs and the internet, especially as they make the shift from using software on a PC to using services on the web.

"These steps are being taken on our own," said Steve Ballmer, Microsoft's chief executive. The move, he said, was a recognition of Microsoft's "unique legal situation," but it was also the company's effort to adapt to "the opportunities and risks of a more connected, more services-oriented world." Microsoft's first step will be to put on its website 30,000 pages of technical documentation detailing how its Windows desktop and Microsoft server programmes communicate and share information. Until now, that information was treated as a trade secret and was available only under a special licence.

Ray Ozzie, Microsoft's chief software architect, said that by sharing more information, Microsoft would make it easier for others to write internet programs that tap

That, Ozzie added, should bring new sets of web services that, for example, might match a person's calendar information with a doctor's schedule. Then smart software could make an appointment. At home, he noted, a person's digital collection of music, movies and family photos would be more easily shuffled to different devices and

"The internet opens up a world of potential innovation," Ozzie said. "And I think we've just scratched the surface."
Microsoft announced other plans to open

up its technology, like allowing developers to add more non-Microsoft document formats to its Office word processing and spreadsheet programs. Microsoft also made commitments to increase its support for industry standards and work with open-source software developers.

source software developers.

European regulators and others have long accused Microsoft of using its dominance in PC operating systems and software to lock out competitors. Last October, after a nine-year confrontation and a ruling against the company by Europe's second-highest court, Microsoft agreed to share information with rivals on terms it had long resisted. Then, after fresh complaints from Microsoft's competitors, the European antitrust regulators last month announced that they were opening new investigations

of the company.

The new inquiry focuses partly on whether Microsoft has withheld essential information from competitors that want to make products that work smoothly with its Office programs. The Office products were not part of the previous European action against Microsoft. After the Microsoft announcement on Thursday, the European Commission issued a sceptical statement. The commission said it "would welcome any move toward genuine interoperability," or allowing software programs from different companies to work smoothly together. But the commission noted that "today's announcement follows at least four similar statements by Microsoft in the past on the

statements by interests in the past of the importance of interoperability."

Asked about the commission's statement, Bradford L. Smith, Microsoft's general counsel, said that the company's moves were "qualitatively and quantitatively different from anything we've done in the past." "People will test us not just by our words but by our actions," Smith added.

The industry is taking a wait-and-see stance on Microsoft's plan. Linux, an open-source competitor to Windows, stands to benefit from Microsoft's more open posture. Regulators and competition are "forcing Microsoft to change the way it does business," said James Zemlin, executive director of the Linux Foundation, a nonprofit consortium. The change comes as Microsoft is trying to buy Yahoo, a huge deal that, if it proceeds, will be closely scrutinised by antitrust officials worldwide. The European regulators typically take a harder line than their American counterparts in challenging takeovers.

#### Stocks slump on US recession fears

**NEW DELHI** — India's stock benchmark fell, paced by banking shares, on concern recent cuts in lending rates will erode their earnings and the US will enter a recession.

State Bank of India, the nation's largest bank by assets, fell for a fourth time this week. The bank has cut its lending rates twice this month. ICICI Bank Ltd, the nation's most valuable lender, declined for a third day.

"The market is signalling to banks that deposit rates should also moderate in line with lending rates," said P. Phani Sekhar, who manages \$25 million at Angel Broking Ltd.

The Bombay Stock Exchange's Sensitive index, or Sensex, fell 385.61, or 2.2 per cent, to 17,349.07 at close. The index fell 4.2 per cent this week. The gauge for banking shares was the second-biggest loser among 18 industry indexes on the exchange this week. indexes on the exchange this week, falling 7.4 per cent. The real estate index was the biggest loser, shedding 8 per cent of its value. The S&P CNX Nifty fell

81.05, or 1.6 per cent, to 5,110.75. State Bank dropped Rs64.60, or 3 per cent, to 2,114.70, extending this week's loss to 8 per cent. The lender cut its key rate 25 basis points to 12.25 per cent this week, after announcing a similar

decrease on February 11. The latest reduction will take effect on February 27. ICICI Bank fell 3.9 per cent to 1,099.40, having declined 7.7 per cent in the week.

Bajaj Auto Ltd, the nation's second largest maker of motorcycles, fell for the first time in seven sessions, declining the most this week. The stock lost Rs115.25, or 4.8 per cent, to 2,295.60, paring this week's gains to 5.6 per cent. It was the worst-performing stock on the index yes-

The Federal Reserve Bank of Philadelphia's general economic index declined to minus 24 in February, it said yesterday, more than the minus 10 expected by economists surveyed by Bloomberg. A drop in the index to at least minus 24 always corresponded with the onset of a US recession, according to data since 1968 compiled by Bespoke Investment Group LLC. — Bloomberg News

# OUNTRY LIVING

Sprawling, sparse and functional, Steve Sharpe's rural ranch gets the best out of simple architectural expression

TEVE Sharpe looked at his land in rural Ventura County in Southern California and envisioned his future home estate with arched door ways, white columns, even a formal ballroom.
Standing next to him was architect Zoltan Pali who saw less Monticello and more modern California ranch - something that could disappear among the orange and lemon groves.

Fortunately, the two men did not have to argue The year was 1987, and soon after Sharpe bought the property in Somis, the economy, the building industry and his income as a drywall contractor took a Southern California was put on hold, much to his relief today.

The recently completed

residence is a dramatic departure from what either man imagined so long ago the result of Sharpe's acquired taste for minimal design and Pali's sharpened skills as an architect of sleek, almost transparent homes. This house, Sharpe says, is the product of two decades of personal evolution and architectural maturity - a design that presents an alternative picture of what country life can be.

"I don't see the house country house responding

to its setting," Pali says.
"Rural has always be associated with simplicity, sparseness and function. That is this house. I see it as a simple architectural

expression with elements boiled down to their essence with no fussy moves, just large and bold geometries. That is as

rural as it gets."

Sharpe's Lucky Dog Ranch covers 40 acres blanketed by a lawn the size of a Little League diamond, plus orchards, a tropical garden and a tennis court. The L-shaped house sits at the end of a 1,000-foot-long, tree-lined drive. Set against the hills, its smooth white stucco and metal-panel exterior walls act like a beacon, as welcoming as a lighthouse

In the back yard, an 80-foot lap pool unfurls like a bolt of fabric toward a concrete pad with a fireplace and the terraced landscape beyond.

Sitting on a sunny deck, Pali remembers those early days, when he and Sharpe first tossed around ideas for the sign. "I thought this, my first house, would put me on the map," Pali says.



sketches as a round Sharpe ditched the rest of their 'treasures', and the couple bought contempo-rary art by Vernon Fisher, Tim Bavington, Robert Therrien and a stainless steel sculpture by Cheryl Ekstrom that replicates the Eames chaise longue and

"This house has really been a shedding experience," Sharpe says.
"Because of it, I realised don't need all this junk I was dragging from place place, and I no longer have the need to decorate every wall. Maybe I won't feel the same way in another house, but too much stuff just doesn't look right here."

He pauses, looks around. "This house is a result of a long, long collaboration. It's about an architect and a client coming of age."





ENGLISH golf champion Henry Cotton said, "Golfers have analysed the game in order to find 'the secret."

There is no secret.' At the bridge table, if you analyse each auction, you will find the secret — the best opening lead — with an acceptable frequency. (No one finds the best opening lead every time.)

Look at only the West hand. What would you lead

against three clubs? North used the Unusual No-Trump to show at least 5-5 in the two lowest unbid suits: here, the minors. (It was a debatable choice because his suits were weak, but it did describe his

hand better than any other bid would have done.) South gave preference to clubs.


When you have an ace-king holding in a side suit not bid by the opponents, it is normal to lead that ace. If you do that here, though, you give South a chance to make his contract.

When you belatedly shift to a trump at trick two, declarer covers with dummy's 10 and takes Fast's jack with his ace South plays a diamond to dummy's ace, ruffs a diamond in his hand, trumps a spade on the board, ruffs another diamond in his hand, and plays a heart.




The defense is helpless You should lead a trump at trick one. Now the defence is a step ahead. Declarer gets only one ruff in his hand and goes down

Here is the guideline (but be warned that it isn't cast in stone): If an opponent shows a two-suiter and the advancer (the overcaller's partner) seems unhappy. consider leading a trump. If the advancer looks happy or positively excited — if is unlikely that a trump lead will be best (but it might!).

# ECOLOGICAL RETHINK

HE US rush to plant more corn for biofuel is already being blamed for soaring food prices. Now, two new US studies show that cultivated biofuel crops may actually increase instead of decrease the carbon emissions that ethanol and other biofuels were supposed to reduce.

The studies used a worldwide agricultural model to calculate how corn-based ethanol nearly doubles greenhouse emissions over 30 years. Planting switchgrass and other wild crops on farm land, as advocated by US President George W. Bush, would increase emissions by

The studies from the University of Minnesota and the Nature Conservancy are

the latest warning against an all-out US rush into corn ethanol at the expense of food for humans and tilling of uncultivated ground.

The authors said their research is the most extensive yet to probe the environmental costs of producing biofu-

Ploughing up rainforests, peatlands, savannas and grasslands to plant corn, sug-arcane and other crops for biofuel releases 17 to 240 times more carbon than the annual savings from replacing fossil fuels, the researchers at the University of Minnesota and the Nature conservancy warned


That's because the plants and soil are a giant carbonstorage system. During cultivation, the carbon escapes as carbon dioxide, a greenhouse gas blamed for global warm-ing, the studies published in Science magazine found. Similar "carbon debt" has

already mounted up in Indonesia, where the authors calculated it will take 423 years to pay off the loss of peatlands to create palm oil plantations, the authors calculated The second largest debt is in the Amazon, where it will take 319 years to recoup the carbon emissions to create diesel-soybean plantations, the study said.

The projected debt figure for ambitious corn-biofuel production targets would be 167 years — the time it would take for biofuels to stop contributing to climate

change, the authors said. "We don't have proper





ncentives in place because landowners are rewarded for producing palm oil and other products but not rewarded for carbon management," said one of the authors, Stephen Polasky, of the University of

The big push for corn-bio-fuel came in early 2007 when Bush called for the US to displace 15 per cent of its annual petrol use with alternative fuels by 2017 — a vast increase over the current 3per cent level. He got con-gressional backing for his tax-incentive plan.

Energy self-sufficiency drove Bush's interest, but he also benefited from the popular image of biofuel as environmental-friendly.

The Washington-based Earth Policy Institute has pre-dicted that ethanol distilleries would need 139 million tonnes of maize by the cur-rent year — almost half of the US harvest — to keep up with US demand, and that's just the beginning. That means not only rising corn prices, but the displacement of corn and other grain-growing to other countries, including the Amazon, as farmers chase rising prices, the study said.

The researchers said it made no sense to convert more land for biofuel produc-tion because "all the biofuels we use now cause habitat destruction3

"Global agriculture is already producing food for 6 billion people. Producing food-based biofuel, too, will require that still more land be converted to agriculture," the Nature Conservancy's Joe Fargione said in a statement The authors urged use of more agricultural and forest waste and native grasses and woody biomass from marginal lands. Affordable technology for conversion to ethanol from these sources is however

still out of reach.

The US is the secondlargest producer of ethanol, after Brazil, which gleans more than 40 per cent of its transportation fuel from renewable sources, mostly sugar cane. Corn is a less efficient Sugar cane produces 5.3 times as much ethanol as does corn: one unit of energy input produces only 1.5 units of ethanol from corn, but 8 units of ethanol from sugar.

# An 'executive physical'

Lifestyle, medical history decide tests for individualised health check-ups

ANY good physical examination is highly individual, whether it's with the family doctor who's known you since childhood or with a team at a hospital-based executive physical programme

Patients going for an executive physical can expect a packet of information to pre-cede their visits. They'll fill out head-to-toe medical information and answer questions about lifestyle and family medical history so that a team of physicians can design a physical for their unique needs. When they arrive they'll be briefed on what tests to expect, and why they're deemed necessary. In general, the first time they go through the exam will be the most extensive

It will include an electro cardiogram, the gold standard for detecting cardiac arrhythmia, and perhaps a stress treadmill test. A chest X-ray, which looks for heart, lung or airway problems, could be part

of the exam.

Bone-density scanning will provide a baseline of bone health, a point from which to accurately measure the rate of future bone loss and possible osteoporosis. Women, depending on age, will get a mammogram to screen for breast can-cer; men, also depending on age, will get a digital rectal exam and a test to screen for prostate cancer. Blood tests to screen for heart-disease risk

factors and thyroid problems as well as fecal occult blood tests and urinalysis will be part of the laboratory testing. A pulmonary function test to check for lung capacity, as well as vision tests and hear ing tests are usually part of the package. A full-body exam by a dermatologist is important, especially in sunny climates. Depending on the patient's

family history and colon can-cer-screening age guidelines, a colonoscopy may be part of the package. But these are usually given every five years not annually. At the end of the exam, patients get the full picture from a physician who has studied their histories and their test results, and consulted with

other specialists, if necessary. Some programmes, such as Scripps Centre for Executive Health in San Diego's La Jolla district, provide consultations with a nutritionist to help atients design a better eating plan, and an exercise physiolo gist to design a personalised exercise plan. Within a few days, patients receive a binder with all their medical information and test results.

Some programmes, such as the one at Good Samaritan Hospital in LA, also provide the information on a CD as well as a computer memory stick — small enough to file with a passport, if patients get sick in Beijing or Paris.




