The rise in number of expats shows an improvement in the economy

MUSCAT: The Sultanate of Oman's population is set to touch 5 million, with the expatriate accounting for nearly 42 percent, according to the latest population clock of the National Centre for Statistics and Information.

As of Tuesday (February 21,

2023), the total population of the Sultanate of Oman reached 4,981,372 with the number of Omanis reaching 2,876,682, thus

In a sign of Oman's economy opening up for overseas workers, the number of expatriates grew steadily over the past year

constituting 57.75 percent.

to reach 2,104,690, thus making up 42.25 percent of the total population. Over the past year, the population of expatriates shot up from 38.71 percent to 42.25 percent with 328,503 expatriates arriving in the Sultanate of Oman, showing an improvement in the economy and better job

prospects. According to the NCSI statistics, the number of expatriates on February 21,2022 were 1,776,187 while a year later the number touched 2,104,690.

Last year, the number of Omanis accounted for 61.29 percent with a total of 2,812,518 but has since declined to 57.75 percent.

After having received the necessary approval from the Ministry of Information and intense hard work of ten months, *Times of Oman* was born on February 23, 1975.







Muscat International Book Fair begins

This edition of the Book Fair, which will be held till 4 March 2023, sees the participation of 826 publishing houses from 32 countries

MUSCAT: The 27th edition of Muscat International Book Fair kicked off at Oman Convention and Exhibition Centre (OCEC) on Wednesday.

The opening ceremony of the book fair was held under the patronage of Sayyid Hamoud Faisal Al Busaidi, Minister of Interior.

Sayyid Hamoud toured the halls of the Fair and visited several corners and pavilions of official institutions and authorities, including those of the Ministry of Information, the Ministry of Culture, Sports and Youth, the National Records and Archives Authority (NRAA), Thakerat Oman Centre, the Ministry of Higher Education, Research and Innovation, the Ministry of Housing and Urban Planning and Oman Vision 2040 Implementation Follow-up Unit.

He also toured the corner of the Omani Women's Association, several corners designated for children and pavilions of participating countries.

Sayyid Hamoud concluded his tour by visiting the guest of honour's corner of South Al Batinah Governorate. In this corner, he viewed several displayed items which reflect the past and present $time\ of\ the\ governorate.$

This edition of the Book Fair, which will be held till 4 March 2023, sees the participation of 826 publishing houses from 32 countries. Those publishing houses will be presenting 533,063 titles and publications. Omani publications stood at 22,950. Meanwhile, recent publications stood at 5,900 while foreign books reached 204,411. Arabic books stood at 260,614.

The activities that are held on the sidelines of the Book Fair include activities for children and families, scientific and cultural corners, a reading corner and cultural cafes. In addition, specific times are allocated for school stu-





US plans stricter curbs on new asylum-seekers

The new rules proposed by the Biden administration are similar to the asylum ban initiated by former President Donald Trump and would make it significantly more difficult for migrants to claim asylum

WASHINGTON: President Joe Biden's administration has announced plans to impose tighter restrictions on migrants seeking asylum in the US.

The new rules proposed by the Biden administration are similar to the asylum ban initiated by former President Donald Trump and would make it significantly more difficult for migrants to claim asylum.

Under the restrictions proposed by the Biden administration, migrants who arrive at the US southern border and simply cross into the United States will be denied

Instead, migrants will need to apply for asylum online through a management of migrant influx in Customs and Border Patrol (CBP)



asylum in the country they crossed to reach the US. The measure will apply to migrants of all nationalities except Mexicans as they share a border with the US.

The rule is expected to be implemented after COVID-related rules, set to expire in May, are lifted.

New rules expected to face obstacles

Trump tried to impose a similar ban in 2019, but a federal appeals court prevented its implementation. The measure announced by the Biden administration is expected to face similar challenges.

The Homeland Security and Justice Departments said it anticipated illegal crossings to climb to between 11,000 and 13,000 if the new measures are not imposed.

The Biden administration stated that the new rules are meant to protect migrants from dangerous journeys and will allow the a "safe and efficient manner." - pw

Nearly one million apply for asylum in EU in 2022

BRUSSELS: Nearly a million people applied for asylum in European countries last year, the highest tally since 2016, according to a Wednesday report by the European Union Agency for Asylum (EUAA).

The agency said it received some 966,000 applications in 2022, which is 50% more applications it received in 2021.

The numbers include applications for countries in the European Union, as well as Norway and Switzerland that are not members of the EU.

Ukrainian refugees in EU states are protected under a separate mechanism called

the Temporary Protection Directive and are largely not part of the asylum applications. The directive aims to avoid slowing down the asylum processes for old and new applicants. Nearly 1,251,815 people applied for asylum in 2016, when the Syrian conflict created the largest wave of refugees to Europe after World War II.

Now, the Russian invasion of Ukraine in February 2022 accounts for the largest movement of refugees since World War II, with more than 7 million people having fled the country. - DW

Earthquake of 5.2 magnitude on Richter scale jolts Nepal

KATHMANDU: An earthquake of magnitude 5.2 on Richter scale jolted Nepal on Wednesday. The quake occurred around Bichhiya of Bajura district at 13:45, the National Earthquake Monitoring & Research Centre (NEMRC), Nepal, said in a tweet.

"An Earthquake of ML 5.2 occurred around Bichhiya of Bajura district at 13:45 NEMRC/SC," NEMRC tweeted.

Recently, at least three houses collapsed after a magnitude 5.8 quake hit Nepal.

The epicentre of the earthquake was the border area of the Himali Village Council of Bajura and Humla's Tajakot Village Council.

Rescuers and local officials said they were finding it hard to get information on the ground due to the inclement weather condition and lack of communication means, as per information. "A few more houses collapsed

in the area after the earthquake. We have got the information that 3 more houses have collapsed in the district," said DSP Surya Thapa.

"Due to the inclement weather condition and snowfall in the area, we are not able to establish contact with other localities. The telephone is not working," Chief of Himali Village Council Govinda Bahadur Malla told ANI over the phone. - ANI

Facebook, Instagram's subscription plan fails to impress

SAN FRANCISCO: Meta's subscription plan for Facebook and Instagram has left a lot of people scratching their heads. After a similar move last year by Twitter, Meta CEO Mark Zuckerberg announced at the weekend an option to pay up to \$14.99 (€14.09) a month for a blue "verified" mark that offers protection against impersonation. But not much else.

Tech analysts say the move has been prompted by the urgent need for new revenue streams after Meta suffered a 40% drop in profits last year and was forced to lay off thousands of staff. Some are skeptical about the demand for the

premium service, accusing the social media giant of being short on new ideas.

Twitter's verification scheme falls flat

Elon Musk's Twitter rushed out its verification plan in November and has so far attracted less than 300,000 subscribers, according to The Information website. One report suggests the churn rate — the number of people deregistering from Twitter's blue badge scheme reached 26,000 during one week this month.

Twitter's projected \$27.8 million in revenue this year from



verification will be a far cry from the billions needed to keep the deeply indebted platform from going bankrupt. While Facebook made a \$23.1 billion profit last year, a severe advertising downturn has hit the social media giant hard and is expected to extend until 2024. The number of users engaging with Facebook and Instagram also appears to have reached saturation point. "This is what I describe as a

risky move," that "clearly could backfire," Dan Ives, a Wall Street analyst from Wedbush Securities, told DW. "Many [Facebook users] could already have one foot out of the door, will this push them out?"

Less than a 1 in 10 take-up rate?

Ives estimated that only 3% to 7% of Meta's 3 billion fans will take up the subscription offer, having

enjoyed free access to their favorite social networks for more than a decade.

Meta Verified

Meta Verified will offer little value add for users at launch other than verification. Facebook already has stronger controls in place against impersonation than its rival Twitter, which is often criticized for allowing so many anonymous and fake accounts.

"A subscription is only attractive for those who are influencers or companies. I don't think many ordinary users will subscribe as there is no major advantage for

them," Martin Emmer, a professor in communication studies at Freie Universität Berlin, told DW.

Meta insists that subscribers will also benefit from direct access to customer service teams - something nigh on impossible for most users at present. Their accounts will also get greater visibility in search engines and additional protection against data theft.

While these are useful add-ons. Meta will need a "richer feature set" to make the subscription plan more attractive, according to Drew Benvie, CEO and founder of the London-based social media consultancy Battenhall.- pw

36% more visas processed across India after COVID-19 pandemic: US officials

WASHINGTON: India is the main priority for the United States, US Visa officials said adding that there has been around 36 per cent rise on visa processing across the country after COV-ID-19 pandemic.

While addressing a presser organised by Foundation for India and Indian Diaspora Studies on Tuesday, Deputy Assistant Secretary for Visa Services in the Bureau of Consular Affairs Julie Stufft said, "India is the number one priority that we are facing right now. We are absolutely committed to getting out of this situation. Anyone in India seeking a visa appointment or visa have to wait for that's not certainly our ideal." She further stated, "So far

this year, we have issued 36 per cent more visas than we did before the Covid-19 pandemic in India. And that is a huge percentage of progress." She also said that they are do-

ing everything to reduce the wait "All the non-visitor time or

student-visa have very very low wait times and that's really key. Our H-1B and F student's wait time were just as high almost six months ago and so we brought down the wait time," she added.

The H-1B visa, under the Immigration and Nationality Act, is a non-immigrant visa that allows US companies to employ foreign workers in speciality occupations that require theoretical or techni-



cal expertise.

Talking about the India-US relationship, Deputy Assistant Secretary for India Nancy Jackson said that people-to-people is the most important tie between US and India.



Oman move a step closer to ICC Cricket World Cup berth

Bigger than big moment, says Oman Cricket chairman Pankaj Khimji

MUSCAT: More than three and half years of hard work and team work, which witnessed thrilling victories and agonising defeats, finally brought joy to the Oman men's cricket team as they became the second team, after Scotland, to advance to the ICC Cricket World Cup Qualifier from the seven-nation ICC World Cricket League (WCL) Division 2.

ICC, the world cricket body, confirmed that Oman have booked their spot in the ICC Cricket World Cup Qualifier, the final round for a place in the Cricket World Cup 2023 in India, having collected enough points to finish among the top-three WCL 2 sides.

Oman Cricket (OC) chairman Pankaj Khimji heaped praise on his players, coaching staff and corporates who supported the Team Red throughout the WCL Division 2 series.

In his remarks after Oman secured a spot in the World Cup Qualifier, which will be played in Zimbabawe from June 18, Pankaj Khimji said: "It is a surreal feeling: Oman making it to the ODI World Cup Qualifier. It is a bigger than big moment.

"The hard work that the boys put in, guided by Duleep Mendis [chief coach] and his coaching staff, ground and administration staff have finally paid off. In this glorious moment, our greatest appreciation goes out to the sports ministry and His Highness Sayyid Theyazinbin Haitham al Said, the Minister of Culture, Sports and Youth. Of course, to His Majesty Sultan Haitham bin Tariq al Said, patron-in-chief of Oman Cricket and our leader. This is a tribute to them, a tribute to our nation for making this moment happen."

Khimji added: "As far as the preparations for the Qualifier full stops. We will pull all our resources together to ensure that this team goes to Zimbabwe as the best prepared team to fight the Qualifier."

The OC boss, who is also the Asian Cricket Council (ACC) vice-president and an ICC director, said: "Oman Cricket deserves its recognition. It has earned it and we have made a mark on the global cricket stage. I am indebted to all my fellow board members, advisors and all those companies and corporates who have supported us over the years for making cricket the most admired sports among the expatriates and now among the locals.

"The last three years have been fantastic and it has been a dream matches remaining, UAE have 27 come true for us: from hosting of ICC T20 World Cup to participating in the T20 World Cup as Associate nation. But now this,

the ODI World Cup Qualifier is an unprecedented achievement. Hats are concerned, there will be no off to my teammates, to my players, who deserve all the accolades."

Oman finish with 44 points

Oman, skippered by allrounder Zeeshan Maqsood, ended the 36-match ICC WCL Division 2 cycle, played over the past three and half years, with 44 points, six points adrift from table topper Scotland.

Oman won 21, lost 13 and tied one while one match was abandoned to reach 44 points with a net run-rate of 0.039. Scotland won 24, lost 10 while two of their games were abandoned to end with 50.

Namibia, UAE and Nepal are in fray for the third and final berth from the ICC WCL Division 2. Namibia have 37 points and two points from 26 matches while Nepal have 26 from 28 games. USA, who ended their campaign with 35 points, and Papua New Guinea

(PNG), are out of reckoning with just 5 points from 28 games.

The equation favours the UAE as they can still garner 20 points from their 10 remaining games to reach 47 if they stay unbeaten. Namibia can reach a maximum of 41 points while Nepal have eight more games remaining and can reach a maximum of 42 points if they win all their remaining fixtures.

World Cup Qualifier in June

This is the first time Oman have made it to the ICC World Cup Qualifier through a qualifying process. The team did play in the World Cup Qualifier in 2005 and 2009.

Oman and Scotland will be joined by either the UAE, Namibia or Nepal from the WCL Division 2 at the Qualifier, which begins in Zimbabwe from June 18-July 9.

The Qualifier will be a ten-nation tournament with top two teams from the Qualifier making it to the Cricket World Cup, to be played in India in October-November.

World Cup qualification, including India as tournament hosts. The other teams that have qualified are New Zealand, England, Pakistan, Australia, Bangladesh and Afghanistan.

Just one spot for the automatic qualification remains through the ICC Super League pathwaywith West Indies, South Africa, Sri Lanka, and Ireland in the race. Zimbabwe and Netherlands have been ruled out of a top-eight spot and will play in the Qualifier.

Besides the top eight teams that gain automatic qualification, the remaining five teams will take part in the World Cup Qualifier along with 5 Associate teams. Zimbabwe and the Netherlands are out of race in the Super League and will feature in the Qualifier.

The bottom-four teams in WCL Division 2 will play a Qualifier playoff and will be joined by winner of Challenge League A and B. The top-two teams from this event will play in the Qualifier.

'Players are my heroes'

A delighted Mendis said: "It has been a fantastic journey for Oman Cricket. We started the WCL Division 2 nearly four years back and have finished among the topthree after playing 36 matches against six high-performance teams. I thank the OC board, headed by Pankaj Khimji, and secretary Madhu Jesrani, for all their support during the journey. They backed us solidly and supported us not only when we were doing well but also when we weren't performing.

"All credit to my players, they are my heroes. They made it happen. It is a very happy occasion for Oman and players, who now stand among the best in the world. When we go for Qualifier, we go with lot of hopes and courage and we will give our best like how we did in the League 2."

Jesrani, who is OC secretary and travelled as team manager during the WCL tours, was overjoyed.He said: "I would like to pay tributes to former OC chairman late Kanak Khimji, whose contribution to the returned with figures of 8-2-15-5 growth of the game is unparalleled. The boys were committed and I am proud of them. The coaching staff,

The players have been true ambassadors of Oman and the team's chief coach, Duleep Mendis, has guided them brilliantly."

Jatinder and Bilal shine

In the 36 matches, Oman played since August 2019, Jatinder Singh, the dashingtop-order batter, amassed a total of 1,098 runs with a average of 32.29. In his 35 innings, he struck three centuries and six half-centuries with his highest score, an unbeaten 118, making him one of the leadingbatters among all the seven nations.

Oman's bowling spearhead, Bilal Khan, had a dream run with the ball as he picked up 76 wickets in 35 matches, to emerge asthe most successful bowlers in the WCL Division 2. Bilal is likely to finish as the highest wickettaker of the series as the next best bowler, Saurabh Netravalkar of the USA,has 58 wickets. Spinner Sandeep Lamichhane of Nepal, who has still eight more games to play, is third with 55 wickets.

Bilal's economy rate was 4.75 with best figure of 5/31, one of his three five-wicket hauls. He also bagged four wickets in a match on three occasions.

Among the best match bowling spells during the WCL Division 2, Oman's Khawar Ali's performance was noteworthyas the all-rounder against Papua New Guinea at the Oman Cricket Academy ground in Al Amerat on 1 October, 2021.
